



Directions to the Event Centre

By car

From motorway 15 it is about 1.5 km to the Event Centre.

By train

There are trains to Silkeborg station from Herning and from Aarhus via Skanderborg.

From the station:

- Town bus 12 to Kejlstrupvej. One departure per hour - none at weekends. Journey time about 11 min.
- Town bus 8 to Kejlstrupvej. One or two departures per hour. Journey time about 20 min.


Price 22 kr, ca. 3 Euro (included in train ticket).

By air

From Billund airport it is about 70 km to the Event Centre. There is an airport bus from Billund airport to Skanderborg station about every hour. There are no direct services from Billund airport to Silkeborg.

From Tirstrup (Aarhus) airport it is about 85 km. Here the airport bus can be used to Aarhus station and the train from here to Silkeborg.

Vehicle rental is available at both airports from well-known car rental firms.



Accreditation

All registered participants must check in for accreditation at the JWOC Event Centre before 11.00 on Saturday 6 July. **Each registered team member and team leader must be present and show her/his personal passport before she/he can be accredited.**

A personal JWOC ID card with photo will be handed out at accreditation. All accredited persons must wear it at all relevant times, and present it for access to all means of transport and authorised zones. The online entry form asks that all persons to be accredited provide a personal portrait photo in Eventor for use on the ID card.

Anti-doping

Doping is strictly forbidden and the organisers of JWOC 2019 are dedicated to supporting the anti-doping authorities in their work. Doping tests are always carried out in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA International Standard for Testing. The IOF Anti-Doping Code and rules and the World Anti-Doping Code 2015 apply as of 1st January 2015.

Athletes who are selected for the doping tests must bring an official identification (with photo) to the doping test area - the JWOC ID card is acceptable.

The athlete should also bring along their Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) if applicable. In general, it is advisable that the athletes bring along their ID to all the competitions and events.

Climate

Denmark has a temperate, Atlantic climate.

At the time of the event the weather is normally warm and pleasant, with temperatures around 16-20°C.

The highest temperature at this time of year is around 28°C and the lowest 6°C.

Rain and showers, some heavy, can occur at this time of the year.

Time-taking and punching system

The SPORTident AIR+ system will be used for both time-taking and race control. Every participant will be issued with a SPORTident Active Card (SIAC) at the first Team Officials Meeting. This must be kept throughout the event and returned after the Relay on the final day.

Terrain information

Middle, Long and Relay:

Terrain areas are located 40-120 m above sea level. Hilly terrain with a lot of contour detail.

The vegetation is mixed forest together with some open areas and areas with scattered trees. A few areas of closely-planted conifer.

Generally good runnability. Some forest areas have variable amounts of brashings and light undergrowth. There are a few small areas with bracken cover. Open areas are mainly covered in grass and heather. The forests are mainly dry underfoot, but there are some ditches, streams and marshy areas.

Developed network of paths and forest roads.





Terrain area is located 40-60 m above sea level.

Open grass areas with scattered vegetation, built-up areas, areas of open and more closely-planted deciduous forest.

Dry and mainly level underfoot, therefore good runnability.

The visibility is generally good.

Developed network of paths and roads in the whole area, including surfaced roads, gravel tracks and small paths.



Hazards:

Adders can be encountered, especially in open areas. Ticks are found extensively in Danish forests and athletes should check for ticks after every run in the forest.

First Aid

First-aid services will be provided in the arenas.

At Teknisk Skole, the Event Office will help with contacting the appropriate service.

Each federation is responsible for its own insurance (see Rule 6.4).

Arena production

There will be TV coverage which will be shown on a big screen in the arenas. This means that there will be cameras in the terrain, and many athletes will run with GPS.

Competition clothing

There are no special regulations applying to athletes concerning the type of clothing they choose to wear.

It is forbidden to use shoes with spikes in the Sprint competition and in Sprint training areas

Team Officials Meetings

For each competition, a Team Officials Meeting will be held before the competition day, providing all important information about the competitions. There will be just one meeting for Middle distance, covering both qualification and the final.

All Team Officials Meetings will be held in the Event Centre in the Teknisk Skole. If you have questions for the meetings, please send them to info@jwoc2019.dk before 16:00 on the respective day, and we will answer them during the meeting.

Rest Day activities

In connection with the Rest Day - Tuesday 9 July - social activities in the form of games, sport and challenges will be arranged at the Event Centre at the Teknisk Skole.

Code of Ethics

'Team presentation' and 'Top 10 list' policy

Both in social media and in displays in accommodation sites there has, over time, developed a tradition to create so called 'top-10 lists'. Here, athletes from different teams appear to have been ranked according to physical appearance. In the same media, 'team presentation' pictures and videos that may appear to be sexually expressive have been published.

Such activity is incompatible with the IOF Code of Ethics and the IOF Policy on Preventing Sexual Harassment and Abuse, and any such activities may lead to sanctions towards individuals or the federations they represent, should these individuals be found responsible for the activities.

The acceptable level as to when a picture or a video may be seen as sexually expressive is unlikely to be the same for different individuals. A guiding principle will be to look at what clothing the athletes would use in e.g. a sprint competition. Any less clothing than this should not be expected to be

considered acceptable. This both relates to posts in a JWOC-related social media or web page and in physical prints in the JWOC accommodation sites.

Team officials of all teams entered for JWOC 2019 are requested to discuss these principles with all athletes that will be entered for the JWOC 2019 competitions. This issue will also be addressed as an item on the agenda of the first Team Officials Meeting in connection with JWOC. Transport

Transport during JWOC

Teams' own transport can be used throughout, except for journeys to quarantine and pre-start areas at Sprint, Long and Middle Distance. For the Relay, teams can use their own transport to the quarantine area. Transport from the Event Centre to quarantine areas for Sprint, Long and Middle Distance is included in the accreditation fee.

Transport can be booked for all other journeys on payment of a fee.

Fee for transport, 50 EUR/ person, includes:

- Transport to and from the Opening Ceremony
- Transport to and from model events
- Transport to Relay arena
- Transport back to the Event Centre from 5 races

**** Full board consists of breakfast, lunch and evening meal.

Clothing can be washed and dried for a small charge.

Type A1 - A4:

Accommodation choices A1 - A4 are at Hotel Scandic Silkeborg, Udgårdsvej 2, 8600 Silkeborg (<http://www.scandichotels.dk/hoteller/danmark/silkeborg>). Hotel Scandic is 4.2 km from the Event Centre. All rooms are with own shower and toilet.

Accommodation A1 - A4 includes only breakfast. It is possible to buy lunch and an evening meal at the Event Centre (A5). It is also possible to buy lunch and dinner directly at Hotel Scandic - teams are themselves responsible for purchasing these direct from Hotel Scandic.

Note: There is no official transport between accommodation A1 - A4 and the Event Centre.

Type B, C, D:

Accommodation choices B, C and D are in the Technical College/College360 and Dania Erhvervs Akademi (Dania Academy). All the accommodation is situated less than 500 m from the dining hall. At accommodation B, C and D most participants and team officials will be able to stay on the same site.

The JWOC Event Centre will be at the Technical College/ College360, and Team Officials Meetings will take place there. It will also be the location for the social activities.

Accommodation B is double rooms in the student hostel. Two rooms share toilet and bathroom.

There are 200 beds in rooms in the student hostel.

Accommodation C is in classrooms with bed, duvets, pillow, bed linen and towel. Max. 10 people per room. Separate rooms for males and females. Common toilets and bathrooms.

Accommodation D is in classrooms including mattress but excluding duvets, pillow, bed linen and towel. Users must bring their own linen, pillows, duvet/sleeping bag and towel. Max. 10 persons/room. Separate rooms for males and females. Common toilets and bathrooms.



Food:

Breakfast:

Breakfast is included in all accommodation choices. Breakfast consists of a buffet with a variety of cereals, bread, cold meat and cheese etc. and various drinks.

Breakfast times:

- Competition days: 6.45 - 9.00 (but from 5.45 on Monday 8/7 - Long distance, and from 6.15 on Thursday 11/7 - Middle final)
- Non-competition days: 7.30 - 9.00

Lunch:

Lunch is included for accommodation choices B, C and D + and can be purchased along with accommodation choice A.

For accommodation choice A - Scandic Hotel: It is also possible to purchase sandwiches at Scandic. Prices from ca. 6 Euro. Price example: triangle sandwich or pasta salad ca. 6 Euro.

Evening meal:

Evening meal is included for accommodation choices B, C and D and can be purchased for accommodation choice A.

The evening meal consists of a buffet with different ingredients including a meat dish, pasta, rice, potatoes and salad/vegetables.

The evening meal is served at the Teknisk Skole/Event Centre between 17.30 and 19.45. Teams eat together.

For accommodation choice A - Scandic Hotel: it is also possible to purchase an evening meal at Scandic. Prices from ca. 24 Euro. Price example: Light Buffet incl. soup, hot main course, salad/vegetables and bread, along with water and juice, ca. 24 Euro.
