
General Matters 2/5

- Organisers provide tents at the Pre-Start Quarantine

- For the pre-start Quarantine zone: Bring the tent on the bus. After use, pack it, and leave it at the Bag Drop; the organisers will bring it to the Arena.
- At the Sprint, there is limited space available for tents in the Team Area.

General Matters 5/5

 If your Accreditation ID badge does not have a photo, you need to bring your passport or driving licence for identification at Doping Test.

Model Event Access

- The organisers are aware that at least one national team has accessed the model event area before the official opening time.
- This was done without the knowledge and permission of the organisers.
- Please respect the official opening hours of the model event areas.

Entries

- Entries for each race must be registered in IOF Eventor latest on the day before the race at 12:00.
- Entries for individual races (with Start Group assignments) and relay team
 compositions may alternatively be handed in to the Event Office on a paper form,
 available from the Event Office. The deadline for handing in the form to the Event
 Office is at 12:00 the day before the race.
- In case of discrepancies between the data entered in Eventor and any paper form handed in, the data on the paper form takes precedence.
- If you need to make a name change for a valid reason, according to the IOF Competition Rules §9.10, until 2 hours before the first start in the relevant class, please use the paper form available from the Event Office.

Fairness 1 (repetition from Bulletin 4)

- It is not allowed to use mobile phones, radios, computers or any other <u>communication devices</u> in the Quarantine not even in flight mode. Neither is it allowed to bring in previous orienteering maps of the competition area.
- When staying in the Quarantine, mobile phones must be completely turned off (random checks possible).
- It is allowed to use music players without any built-in connectivity.
- Inside the Quarantine, competitors wearing headphones might be randomly asked to display their players for checking.
- All tents inside the quarantine must stay open so that it is possible to look inside.
- In Quarantine it is strictly forbidden to bring any electronic devices (except for watches) to bathrooms or any other private rooms no matter whether the devices are turned on or not.
- It is not allowed to use any old maps of the competition areas after having left the accommodation on competition day.


Fairness 2 (repetition from Bulletin 4)

- It is not allowed (and not fair) to gain any unofficial information about the race, especially about courses, maps, location of pre-start etc.
- Except for the Relay, competitors heading to pre-start are not allowed to visit the arenas before their respective competitions. It is also not allowed (and not fair) to gain any unofficial information about the arenas from other persons.
- Competitors are only allowed to use passive GPS devices, i.e. not providing any navigational or mapping function for tracking the route. In case of doubt, Quarantine and start officials might ask certain competitors to have a photo taken of the watch for further investigation.
- Coaching, i.e handover of information, equipment, material, drinks etc. is only allowed in the designated Coaching Zones (maximum two coaches per team). Transferring information regarding the remainder of the courses is strictly forbidden.
- Violations of these rules should be immediately reported to any official, to preserve fairness.
- Violations of these rules may result in the disqualification of the whole team.

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Sprint / Procedures for Quarantine



- Quarantine starts with check-in at the Event Centre (College 360).
- All competitors must be checked in by the Quarantine close time 9:30.
- Team officials using the official transportation must be checked in at the Quarantine before 9.30.
- From the Quarantine check-in, there is bus transport to the Quarantine beside the Pre-start area.

Sprint / Bringing cars/vans for team transport

To facilitate own transport of teams back from the Arena, **Team**Officials may drive to the Arena Parking area, which is near the Prestart (15 min walking distance), provided that

- You register before leaving the Team Officials Meeting
- After parking, you walk to the Pre-start and arrive at the Pre-start before quarantine closes. You'll be provided a map with directions.
- You sign in at the pre-start that you have arrived on time (9.30)

We ask you to show fairness and sportsmanship. Please refer to the fairness rules (Bulletin 4, section 18.0).


Sprint / Transport

- Onwards from the 8:45 departure from The Event Centre, the buses to the Pre-Start bring non-competing athletes and team officials to the Pre-start.
 From there, follow the marked route (red/white tapes) on foot to the Arena.
 You need to check in to the Quarantine - the bus is in the Quarantine zone!
- Self-transporting **team officials and non-competing athletes** must follow directions as described in Bulletin 4 to Arena Parking, and follow the marked route from there to the Arena.
- Arrival at the Arena is not allowed before the Quarantine closes (9:30)

Sprint / General matters

- Please note that there will be photographers and cameramen in the terrain.
- Control guards will be present in the terrain.
- The roads in the area are not closed. It is competitors' own responsibility to keep an eye on traffic.

Question 1: Are competitors allowed to wear GPS watches? Answer 1: Yes, according to the IOF Competition Rules §21.4, IF the watches do not have map or navigation displays, and they are not used for navigation. The organiser does not provide prior approval of specific models. Please refer to the Fair Play section in Bulletin 4.

Question 2: Is it allowed for team officials to participate in JWOC Tour? **Answer 2:** Team Officials and team members not competing can take part in the JWOC Tour

Question 3: Is it allowed for team officials to run in the forest after the competitions ended?

Answer 3: Yes, on the day of the competition. Except for the Middle Qualification, which is still embargoed until the end of the Middle Final competition.

Question 4: GPS vests - can these be available in quarantine, as collecting them at pre-start gives no time for modifications (e.g. with safety pins)?

Answer 4: GPS vests are available at this TOM. Change of size is possible at the pre-start.

Question 5: It would be nice to be able to have breakfast longer than until 9.00 - Sprint and Long

Answer 5: We're able to provide breakfast until 9.30 on Monday for the Long Distance.

Question 6: Bulletin 4 says: "Print technology will be demonstrated on the model event maps". Will there be laminated plastic around the maps for all the distances? Today's maps were easy to tear to pieces? **Answer 6:** No. The paper quality used for the competition is the same as for the model event.

Question 7: What would you recommend for the choice of shoes (% run on grass / forest / asphalt)?

Answer 7: We are not prepared to provide further information than is provided in Bulletin 4.

Question 8: At what point in the courses does the map exchange occur? **Answer 8:** We are not prepared to provide further information than is provided in Bulletin 4.

Question 9: How far through the course is the spectator run through? **Answer 9:** We are not prepared to provide further information than is provided in Bulletin 4.

Question 10: What leg cover is recommended for the rough open / forest on the map (sprint)?

Answer 10: We are not prepared to provide further information than is provided in Bulletin 4.

Question 11: Map change/flip the map - will that be in connection to arena passage? Hard to be ahead in the orienteering if it's an upcoming long leg to the next control after map change/flip the map so it will be useful to know if there are possibilities reading ahead before flipping the map?

Answer 11: We are not prepared to provide further information than is provided in Bulletin 4.

Question 12: Running distance: Is it estimated in shortest route or under the line?

Answer 12: Shortest logical route choice

Question 13: Are there any traffic security out in the terrain or just runners' own responsibility?

Answer 13: According to Bulletin 4, it's the competitors' own responsibility to keep an eye on traffic.

Question 14: The weather forecast says possibilities for rain during the sprint. Is it possible to know how much of the course is gras/cobblestone vs asphalt (could be slippery with wrong shoes..)?

Answer 14: No rain is forecast, though there is no guarantee. We are not prepared to provide further information than is provided in Bulletin 4.

Question 15: Relay teams: Need to entry the teams before middle distance finals are finished (12.00). Can this been set to after finish and we have talked to athletes / got internet on the hotel again to put in the names, approximal around 16.00?


Answer 15: The organizer will respond latest at the Tuesday TOM.

Question 16: The return transport bus on Monday is too late. Is it possible to organize earlier transport?

Answer 16: We hope to be able to provide a return bus at 13:15 on Monday - for those with the optional transport ticket. More info at Sunday's TOM.

Question 17: On today's model event sprint, there have been really small passages between forbidden walls, houses etc, much less than 0,4mm which is ISSOM norm. Will there be these small passages on the map tomorrow as well? Attached example between finish and control 33?

Answer 17: The map is drawn according to ISSOM 2007.



Question 18: Is Quarantine in Lyseng outside?

Answer 18: The organiser provides tents, and you can bring your own.

Question 19: The cut and uncut area on the photo from the model event are both 100% yellow on the map. Will it be similar in the Sprint competition?

Answer 19: This is a mistake on the model event map

Question 20: At map change, is the last control on the first map shown the same as the first control on the second? **Answer 20:** Shown as normal control on second part, not as a start triangle.

Question 21: Which is upward facing side on 2-sided map, when they pick it up?

Answer 21: First part will be the up side, but hidden until the start time.

Question 22: Residential areas - parked cars to be moved?

Answer 22: No.

Question 23: Coaches going to arena parking, being given map showing pre-start - fairness problem.

Answer 23: Taped route instead of a map.

Question 24: Wooden construction at model event?

Answer 24: OK to jump the stile, but not the fence beside it. (This is for Middle Qualification).

Question 25: Lost bag at Model Event this morning. Can it be brought to Event Centre

Answer 25: Please check if you have an extra bag in your team bags.

IOF Code of Ethics

'Team presentation' and 'Top 10 list' policy

Both in social media and in displays in accommodation sites there has, over time, developed a tradition to create so called 'top-10 lists'. Here, competitors from different teams appear to have been ranked according to physical appearance. In the same media, 'team presentation' pictures and videos that may appear to be sexually expressive have been published.

Such activity is incompatible with the IOF Code of Ethics and the IOF Policy on Preventing Sexual Harassment and Abuse, and any such activities may lead to sanctions towards individuals or the federations they represent, should these individuals be found responsible for the activities.

The acceptable level as to when a picture or a video may be seen as sexually expressive is unlikely to be the same for different individuals. A guiding principle will be to look at what clothing the competitors would use in e.g. a sprint competition. Any less clothing than this should not be expected to be considered acceptable. This both relates to posts in a JWOC-related social media or web page and in physical prints in the JWOC accommodation sites.

Team officials of all teams entered for JWOC 2019 are requested to discuss these principles with all competitors that will be entered for the JWOC 2019 competitions. This issue will also be addressed as an item on the agenda of the first Team Officials Meeting in connection with JWOC.
